Tomb D. 9a. 12. Tomb group: XIIth dynasty 7 small vases; kohl pot broken to release the Ka of the face Tomb S. 29. S. 29 is the most remarkable group. It was found with the body of the woman buried in a simple trench grave. Under the head lay masses of beads, cowries, uncut carnelians, blue glaze amulets, and scarabs. On the wrists and fingers, one bears the cartouche of Sheshonk of the XXIInd dynasty. This king is the Shishak of the scripture who is said to have defeated Reheboam. All the beads and scarabs have been restrung in the original order in which they were found. Large vase, white clay, fault in modelling. Small vase, Ptolemaic, broken to release Ka. Pottery ring VIth dynasty, with vase (same dyn.) Predynastic white, wavy line unguent vase. Bowl, last XXIInd to XXVIth dyn. XVIII dyn, large red ware vase

VIth dyn, wide mouth jar.
